Dissertation Binding

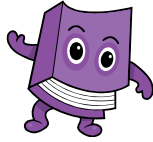
Please note that students may bind final year dissertations using the library's binding machine (there will be a small charge for the binder and covers needed).

Accessing online journals away from Cambridge

Proof of being a University member needs to be given in order to access electronic journals using a computer away from the University network. The easiest way to do this is by making your journal selection on the 'ejournals@cambridge' page, which has a prominent link on the Cambridge University Library website (www.lib.cam.ac.uk). The UL are working on seamless access to ejournals via this page, though in some circumstances you may need to look for an 'institutional login' link and enter your Raven Password to gain access to the article you need. This is particularly important for students going on their year abroad or for students wanting to make use of these resources in the long vacation.
