Answer three of the following questions.

- 1. "The Tanzimat reforms have often been seen as a result of Western influences on the Ottoman legal and political establishment. Alternatively, many scholars have preferred to see them as belonging to an indigenous Islamic and/or Ottoman tradition of reform." Discuss.
- Either: What impact did the West have on Iran during the nineteenth century?
 Or: How did Reza Shah's reign transform Iran's state and society?
- 3. How did North African thinkers respond to the challenge of modernity and French imperialism in the nineteenth century?
- 4. Discuss the tension between idealistic hopes and the experience of homelessness in the early Jewish settlement in Palestine.
- 5. How were Britain and France able to maintain their dominant positions in the Middle East for more than thirty years after the fall of the Ottoman Empire?
- 6. How did North Africans rethink their past in order to reshape their socio-political identities in the first half of the twentieth century?
- 7. Assess the historical significance of **either** the 1956 Suez Crisis **or** the 1967 Six-Day War on regional politics in the Middle East.
- 8. To what extent was the 1979 revolution in Iran an 'Islamic' revolution?
