Post Cold War Japanese Foreign Policy

Professor Miyagi Taizo, Sophia University

Monday, 27th February 2012, Rooms 8 and 9, 5:00pm

Dr. Miyagi Taizô is an Associate Professor in the Department of International Relations, Sophia University but prior he taught at the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies and was a Fellow in the Graduate School of Law and Politics, Hokkaido University. From 1992 to 1996 he worked as a reporter for NHK, the Japan Broadcasting Corporation. He received his PhD from Hitotsubashi University in 2001. In 2004 he published *Japan and Southeast Asia in the Quest for Order: The Cold War, Decolonization and Development, 1957-1966*, (Sengo Azia Chitsujo no Mosaku to Nihon: `Umino Azia' no Sengoshi 1957-1966) which won both the 27th Suntory prize for Social Sciences and Humanities but also the Nakasone Yasuhiro Prize. In 2001 he wrote *The Bandung Conference and Japan's Return to Asia: Between Asia and U.S. (Bandon Kaigi to Nihon no Azia Hukki: Amerika to Azia no Hazama de)*, Tokyo: Soshisha, 2001.
